But spent the entire day at the acquarium \uparrow (2.5) entire day is not exactly accurate, but you know, the acquarium and that was something I was not able to do before, because now I can get useable images, which is about four times more sensitive to light cause the sense area, the sense area is about three times as big, so obviously there is a lot more light being collected in there, and it's a newer and highend camera so obviously its more sensitive and bigger electronically, so you get more light. But she doesn't have that level, but she's got, I gave her lens for her birthday and she signed up for scouts, she's in scouts, she's got a photography course that she can go on. (1.5) she signed up for that, there's hopefully for that that makes her get bitten by the bug, and then I can do the same kind of thing with my sister a little bit later, when she is a little bit older, go out for the day you know (1.7) for an event, I'd really like that \(\) cause um, (1.9) that↓ would be very good↓. She also went to the New Zealand Scout Jambaree, which is over the New Years, great experience, because you are spending New Years Eve with like thousands of people and that is not\u03b1 something that you can not do every day and you are all there for the same thing (.) all there camping, (.) for this big event (.) there's activities everyday, and obviously the countdown, I went to one as well, (.) and I know what's like and the countdown, fireworks, all that fun stuff, and she really enjoyed that um that was a very,

she really enjoyed that, she took the camera there obviously, not sure how much she took pictures but um, she took it there so, used quite a bit. Um, unfortunately at the same time, (1.8) my aunt in England um (1.0), my dad's younger sister passed away. Um which didn't affect my sister at all, she never knew her, my sister really doesn't remember England at all. (1.3) So it's like oh someone I talked to on Skype, twice or three times, but she was in her forties young, passed away from health complications, so dad went back to England, (5.6) actually right in the middle of the Jambaree \, he was going as well as a leader, but he had to leave \, um during the whole thing, it's like New Years day↑ was his flight, so its like awful\(\tau\), awful timing\(\tau\). Um But he got an emergency flight back to England (2.6) and um (2.4) and that was you know that was really sudden. It was his younger↑ sister↑. Not like an older sister, not really prepared↑ for that type of thing to happen. And I knew her \tau when I was younger, so I was like↑ at least knew what she was like, hadn't seen her for ten years so I can't claim to be \tau very affected, but obviously I'm upset about the loss 1. And um I had at least time to bond even though it was ten years ago↑, so I was about eight or nine↑, when I last met her, so (1.6) and um \downarrow , but that was an overall, it was good that my dad did get to go back because it's quite hard to go back to England, to find a reason to go back, it's literally↑ on the opposite side of the world↑. Pretty sure, if you dig a hole↑, actually would come out in England. Very, very close. But↑ it's that close↑ to the other side of the world. It's very hard to find a reason to go back \(\). And um there's an intervention for um my grandfather (1.6) his father who is a ho- (hoarder) his house, his house, is um now thankfully was \((1.7) \) now past tense, his house was in a derelict state.

Basically, the most rooms filled to the brim with books, and more books and even more books and that is just how and that has been an issue for awhile, and I think, I mean, grandma who lived separately, they're divorced↑ now↑, (2.6) got um divorced quite late, you know after all (.) my mom, my father, aunts had grown up, wasn't much of a big deal, they're not really bad in the sense, just \downarrow (1.6) we had our time. And they, my grandma and my aunts couldn't quite deal? with it \(\) (.) grand dad was embarrassed \(\), dad coming back, first time in five years or so (.) um really gave \uparrow (2.3) that opportunity \uparrow , let's say that reason to you know kind of reach out \forall some help so most of Dad's time there was spent with his sisters (.) cleaning out the entire place \(\). You get a skip \(\) um (1.2) to dump stuff uh for each room basically [[]] so each room[†], you empty it (1.4) most of the stuff would get tossed (.) And then (2.3) um: that's one room. But obviously, it's star- at the beginning, its very hard, you got no room to manuever, but over time, it gets easier they said um(.) because you know, you clear out one room, now you have a room to sort stuff\, what gets, what, the first room basically all tossed \(\) cause you couldn't do anything else, (.) like out the door↑, if you don't see anything of significant value, it's gone↑. And the second room is obviously sorted a little bit more because now you have a room to put some of the stuff that wants to be kept in, but you toss the rest. And progressively↑ over time, it got better cause now got two rooms empty, you got a good room and (1.4) a room to give stuff to charity. Yeh, you don't want to keep, but it's still in condition to give to charity so over time, it got easier and easier. I think we found like three pianos because he's a music teac- he's a phy- he used to be a physics teacher, and music teacher; he's very similar to me in a

sense, liking the sciences and the arts, um he visit art galleries, concerts, not typically something a physics teacher does too often, not science museums, but art galleries, natural history museums, that kind of, the arts kind of stuff. (.) um so I guess that's something \((2.3) \) that Dad and I don't, Dad and I have in common, and grandad and I have in common. We like the arts and we like the sciences. Um, you know, but he\ he\ is obviously a music teacher as as the piano progressively gets buried under stuff, he buys a new piano, he puts it in the next room (laughter) instead of throwing away the stuff[†], that gets buried (laughter) its like three three pianos and four electric keyboards or something in [[]] his house. You know, it's just ridiculous.

Interviewer: Let's go on to the third question. What is your major and how do you like your classes so far?

A.I: Oh, gosh, that's↑ a hard question. Major↑ is um: I've decided and hopefully, will win basically the lottery type thing random cause mechanical engineering you got three um majors, you get to choose between you got the control engineering which is about robotics and the small, the smaller stuff and that's (free), closer to computer programming, you know doing a lot more of the logic, (1.1) of: (3.8) how you how you would get a robot to do what you want to do (.) how to get it from A to B\u00e1, to to a certain place versus\u00e1 um the mechanical engineering \(\) course which is your classical mechanical engineering↑, big↑ machines, um steel mills\u00e1, cars\u00e1, that sort of thing the cars \(\) on the mechanical side control deals with self-driving, (2.5) uh uh cruise control that type of thing controlled us, (.) and mechanical engineering, the engine, the bodywork, the transmission. (.) all that sort of stuff, and then you got (.) aerospace which is

more specialized, and of those three, the son of a computer programmer, and having an interest in computers and electronics as well, I felt the choice for me: (.) and I don't know the results obviously, so I don't know if that is my\ major\, but hopefully, it will be, it is control↑, so that's the micro↑, the microelectronics, and um (3.4) electric motors and servers instead of gears and large gears and combustion engines and all of that, so my major will hopefully \(\) um will be in not exactly sure, what sure how to translate things control engineering, that kind of typ- I think that descent approximation \(\) as to what it would be (1.1) where you basically↑ studying sy- the methods of controlling the machinery (1.5) um, not necessarily↑ the physical creation↑ of it but more the systems you would do for the: control of it \(\). Um (3.3) in terms of the small, um the code (2.0) and and (2.6) wiring of all of that \uparrow , (.) my major that how how am I liking my classes (.) I think I did mention (at) the start it's very dependent↑ on whether you know I feel comfortable (.) the way: it's being taught\u00e1, some↑ of the classes you know, not particularly † enjoying and that's generally because of the way its being taught obscure and I'm not really sure (.) what (is) expected \(\) of me, and I think that's my major \(\): (.) gripes, less of the professors \(\) they're just there to do their job, they're really there to do their research, the teaching is a necessary thing. So I know that some of them really don't want to spend too much time \(\) (.) and they want to get on with their research and I respect that as long as (3.2) you know↓ it's not them↑ dictating to the white board \(\) or the blackboard in this case, sometimes feels like and I feel most of my classes I I the more technical subjects I enjoy the ones that you actually (.) get to do something↑ (.) the ones that I really↑ enjoy

you know, I got like the problem↑ based learning \(\) (.) um information PBL (.) where you create \tau little projects with a microcontroller and um um breadboard, and a few other components of your choice, that that those are the classes that I'm really enjoying, where you learn about physically do something practical \(\) (.) in terms of you know↑ as a project↑ and and obviously going along↑ that is a very clear↑ set of expectations and what is expected of you and your group \uparrow (1.3) and as I mentioned earlier that is something that I'm used to, for better or for worse and that is something that I find is very helpful for me. I think it would be helpful for everyone (1.2) to be honest and so I guess to answer the question of how I am liking my classes, it's very um to give a broad↑ statement↑, it would have to be perclass level of statement, and as I said the ones I do enjoy are the problem based learning ones where I get err at least understand practical implications of what I'm learning where as the ones I'm enjoying less, um the ones that are very heavy in, just stuff where you can't see where it goes like math, some there are two physics classes, one of those eh, I don't see where that goes \(\). Obviously \(\), all \(\) of them in the end help\u2207 but um: (.) I I enjoy the classes where I can see where this is going (.) I can see how how it helps, those end up being the more practical classes the ones (.) so I guess as a blanket statement, it's hit or miss\, best way to put it, some of them, enjoying very much\(\bar\), (.) some I quite um dislike↑ (1.5) but that's more↑ to do with the subject than than um the professors. I can't say that I really (.) have any issue with the professors↑ themselves. It's just more↑ the nature of the classes, some I naturally enjoy, the more practical ones than the purely theoretical ones, the ones I tend to dislike, um (2.5) I guess the only (1.1) the only issue

(1.7) you know it's like the only issue, the only issue I really have is that they're just dictating to the white board, writing a block of text, I find that very hard to follow, obviously being less experienced in Japanese than my peers um that has caused a few problems, um (2.7) but obviously is getting↑ better↑ every time but still not perfect if it is more, I can see the results↑ more physically now ah that is very easy to tell↑ um if I got things right or I got things wrong↑. It is very easy to tell in terms of how it is going. (3.4) Yeah.
